Z-bie Survival Challenges

- Deliver the Z-bie Vaccine to the Topenebee survivors of the Z-bie attack
- To deliver the Vaccine each patrol will need to complete 8 challenges.
- At each challenge the Scouts will
 - o Demonstrate their ingenuity and Scouting skills
 - Determine the GPS coordinates (UTM) for each station (fire ring) so we know where the Z-bies have been. Turn in coordinates at Scouter's West after your last station.
 - o Receive one of the ingredients to the Z-bie Vaccine to deliver to the survivors

- o 1st Aid Kit
- Three scout staves, each at least 6 ft long
- Tent pegs/stakes
- GPS Receiver/Cell Phone with GPS App
- o Knife
- Hatchet with sheath, and/or hammer/mallet
- Clip board with paper 81/2 x 11 for mapping
- o Pencil/pen
- o Patrol Flag
